How To Cast Your Ballot

Types of Voting



- ❧ Early Voting – October 15, 2020 – October 31, 2020
 - ❧ One-Stop In-person Voting – complete the ballot at the polling place
 - ❧ Same-day Registration – if you are not registered, you can register to vote AND vote on the same day.
- ❧ Voting by Mail
 - ❧ Absentee Ballot Mailed – complete the ballot and place the ballot in the US Mail. Access this link to get step-by-step instructions: <https://www.ncsbe.gov/voting/vote-mail/five-steps-vote-mail-north-carolina-2020-general-election>. To ensure its arrival, mail by **October 24, 2020**.
 - ❧ Absentee Ballot Drop-off – complete the ballot and take it to the Board of Elections in your county to drop it of. Access this link to get step-by-step instructions: <https://www.ncsbe.gov/voting/vote-mail/five-steps-vote-mail-north-carolina-2020-general-election>. For Wake County, take the completed ballot to **1200 N. New Hope Road, Raleigh, NC 27610**.
- ❧ Voting on Election Day – November 3, 2020
 - ❧ Can cast a ballot ONLY at your designated polling site. To find out where your voting site is, access: <http://www.wakegov.com/elections/voters/Pages/voterinfo.aspx>

Absentee Voting



☞ Absentee Voting

- **Request Your Absentee Ballot Online**

- In 2020, all registered North Carolina voters, including voters serving in the military or living overseas, can request an absentee ballot online through the Absentee Ballot Request Portal.

- The Absentee Ballot Request Portal: <https://votebymail.ncsbe.gov/app/home>. **Last date to request an absentee ballot is October 27, 2020.**

- Allows registered North Carolina voters to securely request an absentee by-mail ballot completely online. The request may be made by the voter or their near relative or legal guardian. The voter's county board of elections will mail the ballot to the voter.

- Helps avoid duplicate requests by informing voters of existing absentee requests, and allows users to submit subsequent requests to update information on a previously submitted request.

- Allows military or overseas voters to request and return their ballots through the portal.

☞ Ballots must be postmarked by Election Day, November 3 and received by November 6 for mailed ballots OR delivered by Election Day, November 3 at 5:00 pm to the designated drop-off location. **Mail by October 24!**

☞ You can TRACK your ballot - monitor how it is being handled!

In-person Election Day Voting Tips



1. Polls across North Carolina are open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Voters in line at 7:30 p.m. will be able to cast a ballot. Lines tend to be longer before and after normal business hours.
2. Find your Election Day polling place through the Voter Lookup Tool or the Polling Place Search.
3. Sample ballots are available through the Voter Lookup Tool.
4. **To protect voters and election workers, masks and hand sanitizer will be available to all voters. Social distancing will be enforced at voting sites. Read more at the Voting and Coronavirus page.**
5. Same-day registration is not available on Election Day.
6. Voters are not required to show photo ID to vote in 2020 elections.
7. Information about N.C. Supreme Court and N.C. Court of Appeals candidates is available in the Judicial Voter Guide.
8. Voters who need assistance at the polls must request that assistance. Individuals who are unable to enter the polling place may vote curbside. Once inside the polling place, voters who experience difficulties should request help from an election worker.
9. The State Board asks that all voters respect the right of others to participate in the election. Intimidating any voter is a crime. Voters who feel harassed or intimidated should notify an election official immediately.
10. If you present to vote and your name is not on the voter list, you may request a provisional ballot. About 10 days after an election, voters who cast a provisional ballot can check the status of their ballot with the Provisional Search Tool.

Curbside Voting



☞ Curbside Voting Early Voting OR on Election Day

☞ If you are unable to enter the polling place, you **HAVE THE RIGHT** to vote at the curbside. Curbside voting is offered at all Wake County polling places. To be eligible for curbside voting, you must be unable to enter the polling place due to age or physical disability. Look for the parking spaces near the polling place entrance labeled "Curbside Voting." Poll workers monitor the parking area throughout the day and will walk to your car when you park in one of the designated spaces.

Important Voting Dates To Know



- ❧ Election Day – Tuesday, November 3, 2020
- ❧ Early In-person Voting – October 15, 2020 – October 31, 2020
- ❧ Absentee Voting by Mail –
 - ❧ To ensure its arrival, mail by October 24th!
 - ❧ October 27th – last date to request an absentee ballot.
 - ❧ If mailing, it must be postmarked on or before Election Day.
